I can't tell you how shocked and disappointed that I and many other community members were with the way you ran the CPA meeting on July 18th. I am still hearing from folks who were very unhappy with the treatment they received...including CPA Trustees.

You took an oath of office swearing that you would:

Uphold the highest standards of community service
Fairly and and impartially consider all points of view
Refrain from self interest
Respect all those with whom and for whom you serve

Dedicate your service towards the betterment of the La Jolla community.

Many people from the community had dedicated untold hours examining the micro-mobility corral issue prior to the meeting. We took time out of our busy lives to attend the meeting, but most of us were neither recognized or respected. This is not OK.

I was one of two people in the audience who had personally visited all 122 proposed corral locations, and could have provided pertinent information to be considered by the Trustees.

The gentleman next to me had a very concise PowerPoint that you refused to allow him to show. You denied the community and the Trustees, who were going to vote on this issue, the opportunity to benefit from this important information. It would have taken no more than four minutes. More than enough people had ceded their time to him. Apparently this didn't fit your agenda. You called on people by name and virtually ignored others. That is not OK.

You were unfair and disrespectful to some trustees also. Some Trustees were permitted to speak for as long as they wanted while others were cut off. That is not OK.

You spent an inordinate amount of time deciding whether to support a "letter" related to The Map in Kellogg Park and allowed a long simmering family feud play out at this public meeting.

You should have allocated more time to the enormously time-sensitive and important community issue of the proposed micro-mobility corrals. If the corral issue is not handled judiciously, we will be left with a very dangerous Public Safety situation.

I and others want to be treated with respect at all future meetings. Multiple people suggested a group letter be written but I have decided to just sign my name.
