

## Parks & Beaches CIP List 2020

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1. Pottery Canyon Natural Park:
  - a. **Remove dead and dying eucalyptus and other fallen trees to reduce fire hazard.**
  - b. Install two picnic tables.
  - c. Grade and maintain a parking area.
  
2. Coast Walk Trail:
  - a. Repair cliff subsidence along Coast Walk, especially the eroded section encroaching into the trail at the rear of 7981 Prospect Place; repairing might require construction of some form of bridge.
  - b. Conduct property line and parking feasibility study on Coast Walk Drive.
  
3. Goldfish Point/Cave Store area:
  - a. Provide safety barrier between metal railing where it transitions to wood railing. (Across from Goldfish Point Café.)
  
4. Scripps Park – (funded, Ref. S15035); in coordination with the (La Jolla Cove) Pavilion:
  - a. Repair and expand the sidewalk along the southeast section of Scripps Park and Coast Boulevard (1100 block of Coast) as part of the Pavilion project. Add planters along the walkway to help guide foot traffic onto the pavement and protect the grass along the walks.
  - b. Inspect and replace as needed all rusted BBQ grilling facilities in Scripps park. Replace metal grates that are crumbling and flaking or replace entire receptacle where pedestal mounts are failing.
  - c. Install La Jolla “branded” bike racks in lieu of existing racks as part of Pavilion project.
  - d. Consider adding a bocce ball court in the vicinity of the Bridge Club (where a shuffleboard court used to be).
  - e. Upgrade two picnic areas, particularly including the site of the former “Lorax tree”
  
5. Add additional steps at the bottom of the staircases to the Cove Beach to provide access all the way to the sand without a large drop off.
  
6. Coast Boulevard:
  - a. Conduct a comprehensive traffic and parking study of Coast Blvd from the 939 building to the connection with Coast South at the south (300 block) which would widen the sidewalk in the 900 block of Coast Blvd and move parking from the west side of the street to nearby areas, with a goal to beautify the coastal experience and improve pedestrian and vehicular navigation.
  
7. Children’s Pool:
  - a. Repair and reopen multipurpose beach access ramp.
  - b. Repair and restore the Children’s Pool seawall railings and walking surface on the top of the wall.
  - c. Remove unsightly rusted gates currently blocking the beach access ramp at Children’s Pool.
  - d. Repair & restore stairway to the beach at Children’s Pool
  - e. Evaluate erosion damage to the breakwater wall where it meets the natural bluff.
  - f. Clean beach of animal waste at the spring reopening transition for human use.
  - g. Provide hot coal disposal container.
  
8. South Casa Beach:
  - a. Remediate bluff erosion and destruction of plant life along Coast Boulevard sidewalk above South Casa Beach. Consider installing ropes and other barriers to pedestrian traffic similar to what has been used at the Children’s Pool and at Whale View Point.
  - b. Replace bench bearing “Gartner” plaque. 700 block Coast Blvd Completed, this is the same as the Cornelius bench
  - c. Repair or replace slat on bench across from the Casa de Manana. {move to maintenance list}
  
9. Whale View Point Shoreline:
  - a. Study storm water drainage and erosion control solution at People’s Wall at 698-52 Coast Blvd. Develop an engineering plan to remediate drainage and reconstruct the original cobble-stone wall retaining wall and DG walkway west of the Wall. (no shotcrete or gunite).
  - b. Install post-and-chain fencing along the sidewalk adjacent to the field of sea lavender in the 400 block of Coast Boulevard. Not completed as of 6/25/20

- c. Restore the concrete caps on the People's Wall at the north and south ends.
  - d. Reinstall the original lamps (~50) along the top of the People's Wall.
10. Marine Street / Sea Lane Beaches
- a. Install and maintain hot coal disposal containers at each beach entrance.
  - b. Return City fire rings to the beach to enhance safety for beach fires.
11. Windansea:
- a. Repair storm drain causing erosion at 6933 Neptune Place between Kolmar and Rosemont Streets; explore availability of federal funding given the deterioration.
  - b. Repair storm drain on Neptune at the foot of Palomar St.
  - c. Install and maintain hot coal disposal containers near parking area.
12. Calumet Park and La Jolla Hermosa park.
- a. Add another picnic table and two additional benches.
  - b. Cortez Place (Hogan's Beach access):  
Repair or replace the deteriorated storm drain causing severe erosion and damage to the bluff and threatening the heavily used access to the pocket beach known as Hogan's.
13. Fay Avenue Bike Path:
- Develop a plan for maintenance and fire mitigation with clear lines of City responsibility for both. Re-surface the entire bike path with DG or asphalt.
