Dear Ms. Larson:

Our members have followed for years now the work on the La Jolla Cove "Pavilion" comfort station, the initiative for which our organization provided and to which we contributed the initial design. We understand that construction timing has been delayed due to contractor restrictions on working during the pandemic. We support the request to the City that there be a waiver of the 2021 annual beach area construction moratorium for the project (aka E B Scripps Park Comfort Station Replacement, CIP Ref. S15035) so that the work can be completed without additional delay.

We do not believe that construction during the summer will create a negative impact in the area and completion of the project sooner rather than later will be a benefit to all. We believe other relevant La Jolla community groups, which have supported the Pavilion project, would join in supporting this waiver if requested.
