I am running for reelection as a trustee of the LJCPA because I'd like to contribute my past experience in the LJCPA and the LJSPRC and continue to support the work of the LJCPA. It will be a challenging time since the City Council seems poised to make many changes to the role and functioning of Community Planning Groups.

Over the years I have been a member of and an officer of a number of non-profit organizations including educational and non-partisan groups having a community and a public policy interest.

I live in the La Jolla Shores Heights section of La Jolla Shores and was a member and then Chair of the LJS Permit Review Committee from 2008 to 2013.
