Team of 2 rangers – first thing in the morning to contact vendors. They will find what times people show up and be there to prevent setup.

1st amendment operators

1st amendment operators can still operate The First Amendment provides that Congress make no law respecting an establishment of religion or prohibiting its free exercise. It protects freedom of speech, the press, assembly, and the right to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

May be operating a business. Some have a brick set up amendment. Should be someone with an artistic nature / political and religious / if making themselves

could fall into the category. Should be requesting donations rather than having prices, Venmo, etc.

City will be looking into designating specific areas for 1st Amendment operators, similar to what Scripps Park did on the east end near the Cove and the west end toward Children's Pool.

Port District:

City will also be looking into the Port District Embarcadero vendors along the bay. Primarily north of Seaport Village to the wharf behind the Midway aircraft carrier.
